confined in goal. They supported by him during the  
time for which he never received any satisfaction or  
payment the mem<sup>o</sup> as follows

1750 September 3 - The Indians were bro<sup>t</sup> into Major's  
Goal and they were discharged the 29<sup>th</sup> Day of  
February following —

I Humbly beg your Hon<sup>ble</sup> consideration & order for  
such sum as you in your great goodness shall think  
proper ~~and~~ and am most respectfully your Hon<sup>ble</sup> most  
Obedient, Humble Serv<sup>t</sup>
