State of New Hampshire Straford County  
To Benja Nutter Constable of Barnstead  
& To the Keeper of the Goals at Dover in  
County - - - - - Greeting

Whereas Richard Sineler Jun of Barnstead in said County  
Gentleman on the 17 Day of October 1783 was  
Brought before me John Tupper Esqr one of the Justice  
of the peace for sd County requiring him to find sufficient  
Bon Sureties of the ~~same~~ for his appearance at the  
Next Court of Quarter Sessions of the peace to be holden  
at Dover aforesaid on the third Thursday of November Next  
To answer to such thing as shall then and there be  
objected against you in behalf of the Government of sd  
State by Jacob Daniels of Barnstead in said County  
Gentleman and in the mean To keep the peace  
Towards <sup>all</sup> the Subjects of said State and Especially Towards  
the said Jacob Daniels and whereas Richard Sineler  
hath refused and still ~~refuse~~ doth refuse before me  
to find Sureties there are therefore in the Name  
of the people of the State of New Hampshire To  
Command you the said Constable forth with To Convey  
the said Richard Sineler to the Goals in Dover aforesaid  
and To deliver him to the Keeper thereof there <sup>then</sup> thereto  
With this precept and do in the Name of the people  
of said State of New Hampshire kindly Command you the said  
Keeper to receive the said Richard Sineler Juner into  
Custody in the sd Goals & him Safely to keep untill he  
shall find such Sureties as aforesaid or be otherwise  
~~Let~~ liberated a Greacable To Law  
Given under my hand and Seal at Barnstead  
in said County the 2 Day of November AD 1783

brought before Tupper the 10<sup>th</sup> John Tupper Just<sup>ice</sup>  
against the 17<sup>th</sup> -  
agreed it was to be tryed before him &  
found the 21<sup>st</sup>
