Grudgery New King in Stunning Coup

In a startling development, the right wing forces of John NitWit Grudgery moved swiftly into Room 202 yesterday and ended the rule of King Eric the Fair.

The former King first occupied the throne in December of 1981. At that time, he was characterized as "Riverdale Jones," the long-awaited hero who would fervently seek out the national reputation for Hofstra Law. Many at his coronation had proclaimed Eric as "the new hope." His support has weakened in recent months, however, as his moderate policies caused increasing student dissatisfaction. Recent criticisms directed at the King became more heated when he announced a marked increase in faculty salary from behind the wheel of his vanity-plated El Dorado. Students were enraged. The King was to be burned in effigy in the front parking lot earlier this week, but the demonstration had to be cancelled for lack of space. Student criticism continued and Eric's control weakened. It was at this point that John NitWit Grudgery seized power.

Grudgery's first official act was to light a

foul-smelling cigar and burp. He then appointed himself President for Life and went about selecting his Cabinet. Bruton C. Urgata was named Appointments Secretary, whose responsibility it is to keep all government functions punctual. Other appointments were as follows: Leery Kissler, procurer of student affairs; Chinda Lamplin, promoter of interracial harmony; Stron Ilverman, director of interrogations; and Devo Diamond, secretary of recreation.

After naming his Cabinet, President Grudgery then suspended the First Amendment, and all student publications were terminated. A series of laws were then enacted by decree: all students were required to shave their heads, march in grey uniforms, and have their ID numbers imprinted on his left forearms. The faculty members were issued brown shirts, baggy trousers and black boots. Any student found speaking out of turn will be summarily executed.

Sly Fox, former student government president, was sent to the guillotine at dawn today as what Grudgery called, "an example to all those who think they have something to say."

Faculty Uproar at Hofstra Over Student Letter

Today at Hofstra Law School over 100 teachers jammed themselves into room 230 to voice their views over a student letter sent to all members of the faculty and Dean Smurfztz. The contents of the letter concerned the current unprofessionalism and lack of intelligence by the Hofstra faculty. In an effort by the students to raise the standards of Hofstra Law School, a letter was issued containing 1003 complaints of faculty inadequacies. The student allegations ranged from teacher boredom to the inability of the teachers to communicate in English.

Today a special Ad Hoc Committee consisting of 55 students and one faculty member was appointed by Student President Sly Fox to alleviate the current problem. Sly Fox was quoted as saying, "That if the majority of the students feel this, then so do I. (If I want to be re-elected.)" When Dean Smurf-

tz was asked why the faculty was so angered by the allegations contained in the letter, Mr. Smurfztz was quoted as saying, "The truth hurts," as tears began to fill his eyes.

The *Guilty Conscience* then conducted a poll of several professors concerning the crisis. Professor J.N. Grudgery told us what we could do with his model penal code. 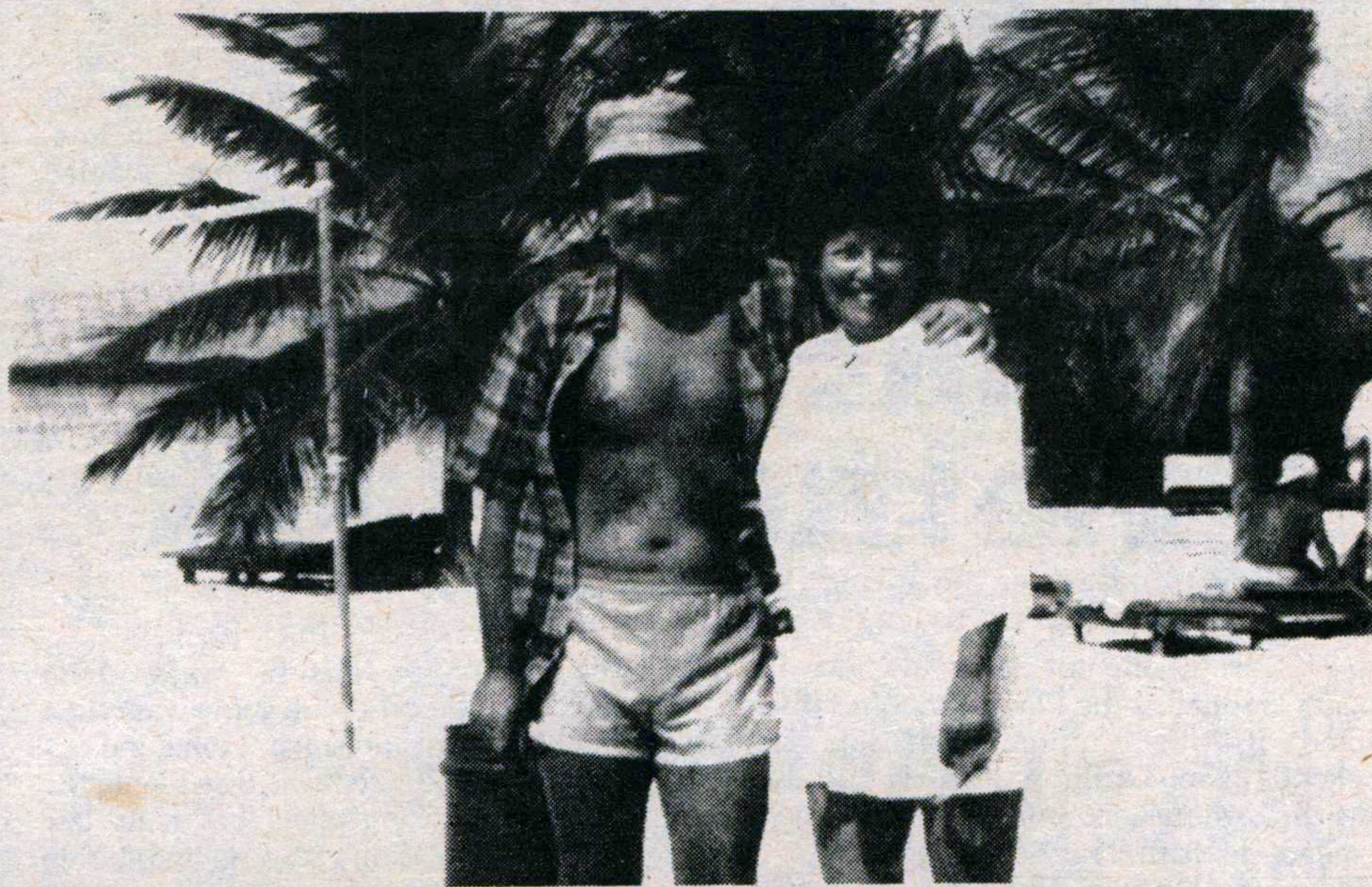
Dean "Ricky" Smurfztz has purchased the Levitz furniture store in Westbury yesterday, in a move calculated to "get some chairs at wholesale prices."

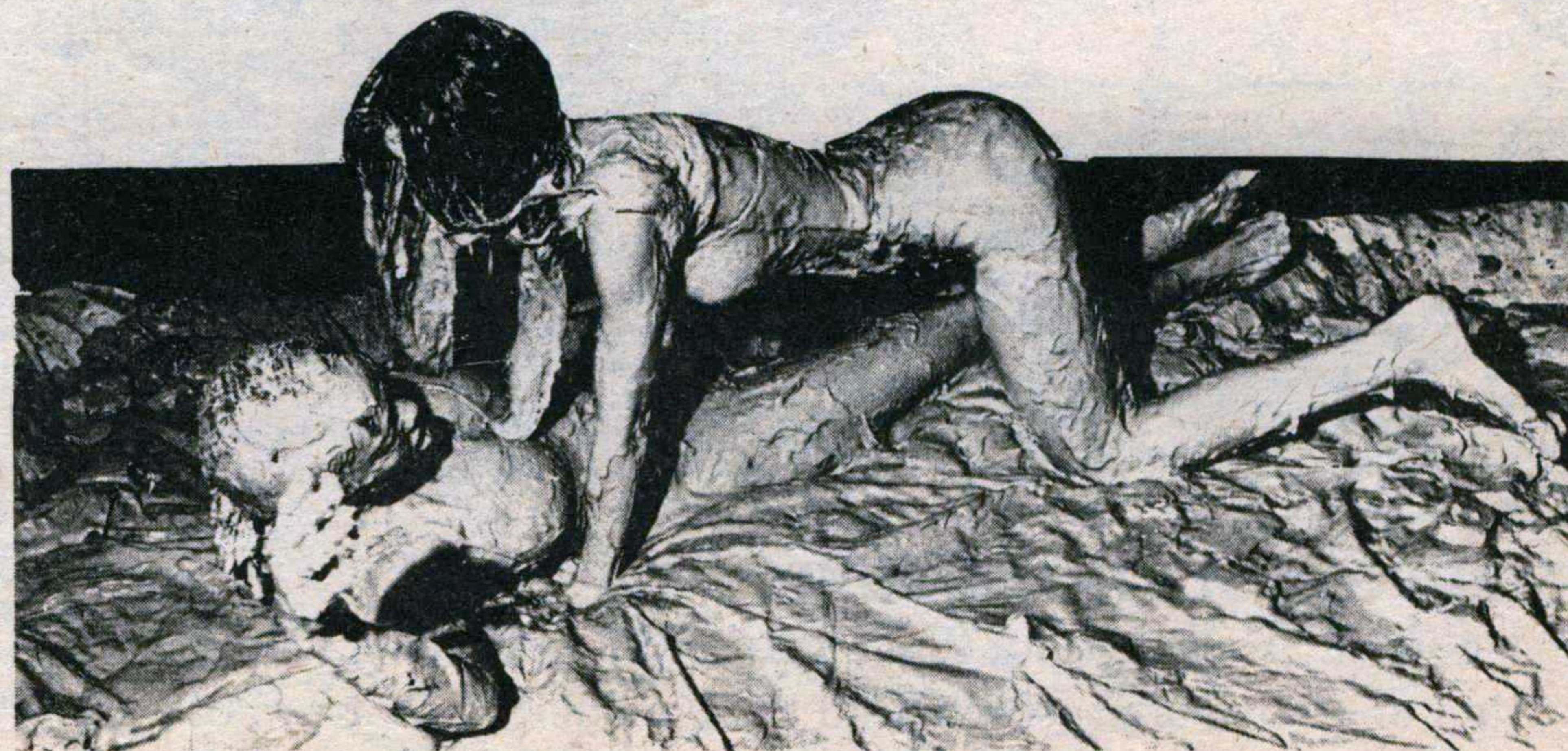

In a valiant attempt to create jobs for Hofstra graduates, the Placement office conducted its first annual Telethon last weekend. The Telethon appealed to law firms throughout the country to pledge jobs for needy Hofstra Law School graduates.

Placement Director Who Christenson said he was "basically pleased" with the results, although the tote board showed less than 50 percent of the expected 300 pledges. Q. to offer tips on income taxes. "The most effective portion of the show was when we brought students on stage. I think the opportunity to actually see these disadvantaged students had a strong effect on many law firms. The phones didn't stop ringing during those segments," said Christenson.

Christenson also stressed the national reputation of Hofstra, as 95 percent of the pledges came from firms in Alabama, South Dakota and Puerto Rico. Christenson said that those students interested in applying for these positions should submit their resume to the Placement Office.

Better Grades Through Science?

A book by a Hofstra University Law Professor has hit the New York Times Best Seller List. Marc S. O'Lofsky's *Statistics About Harvard Law Students* this week placed second on the chart of the most widely read non-fiction works. O'Lofsky's work was previewed in an article in the December edition of *Conscience* in which O'Lofsky revealed that "95% of Harvard students are prepared for class." Of the 5% who are unprepared, O'Lofsky intimated that a substantial portion committed suicide. Although O'Lofsky himself has never attended Harvard nor taught there, he compiled his data by "talking to people I know who know other people who went to Harvard."

O'Lofsky's data reveals that Harvard students are quite knowledgeable in some areas, but seriously lacking in others. For example, over 92% of the sample, when asked to name Bambi's rabbit friend, correctly identified "Thumper." But less than 0% could identify outgoing Hofstra Placement Director Who Christenson. When confronted with this figure, Christenson admitted "surprise" but stated that he expected "no change in

the overall placement picture" to result from his lack of recognition.

O'Lofsky now plans a follow-up work, to be called *Statistics About Columbia Law Students*. He will pay \$10 for interviews with "anyone who knows anyone who has attended Columbia."

License Plate Rule Enacted

In a surprise move by Dean Smurftz all students and faculty will be required to obtain new license plates for their cars which reflect their position within the Law School.

According to one insider, the idea occurred to the Dean one day after he noticed that he was the only person at the school with license plates bearing his position - "LAW DEAN." Believing that this edict would put Hofstra a step closer to national prominence, Smurftz is requiring Vice Dean Rabinowitz to get plates bearing "VICE DEAN" and Assistant Dean Douglas to display plates bearing "ASSIST TO DEAN." students in the second and third year with license plates between #1-2L and 3L through #50-2L and 3L will be provided with reserve parking spaces at no charge. Responding to criticism that this arrangement is unfair to students in the bottom half of the class, Who Christenson, alias "PLACEMENT", responded, "they will just have to fend for themselves."

Sly Fox, President of the Student Government Association, finds the Dean's edict unfair, capricious and highly suspect. It is rumored among insiders that by order of the administration, Jordan's plates will read "THE FOX."

In spite of all the criticism and controversy that the Dean's edict will no doubt raise, many of the students and faculty welcome such a change.

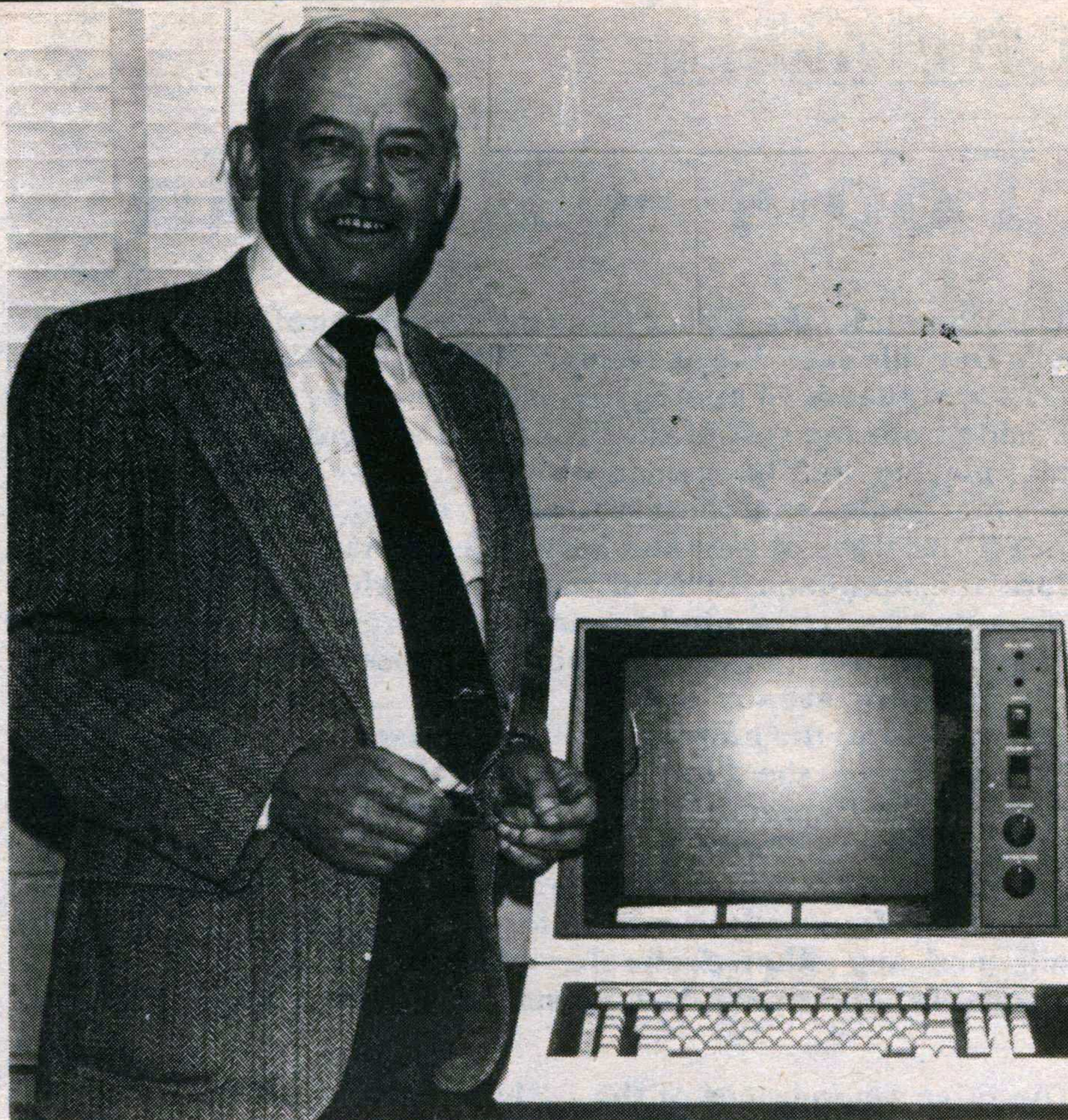
E.T. Enrolls at Hofstra

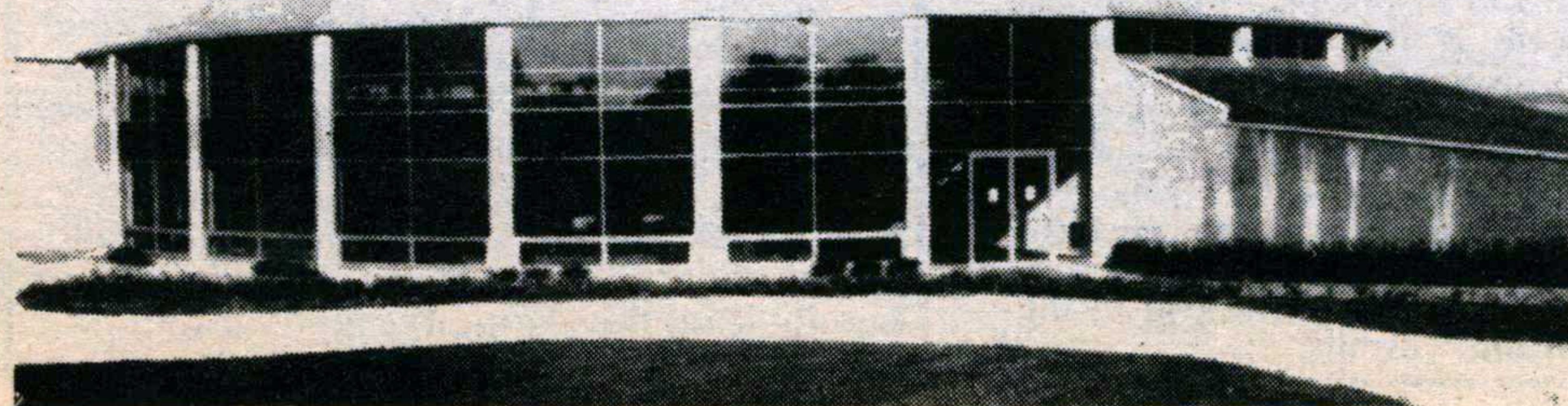

Who needs Orlofsky — nobody wanted to take his classes, anyway. And Posin, good

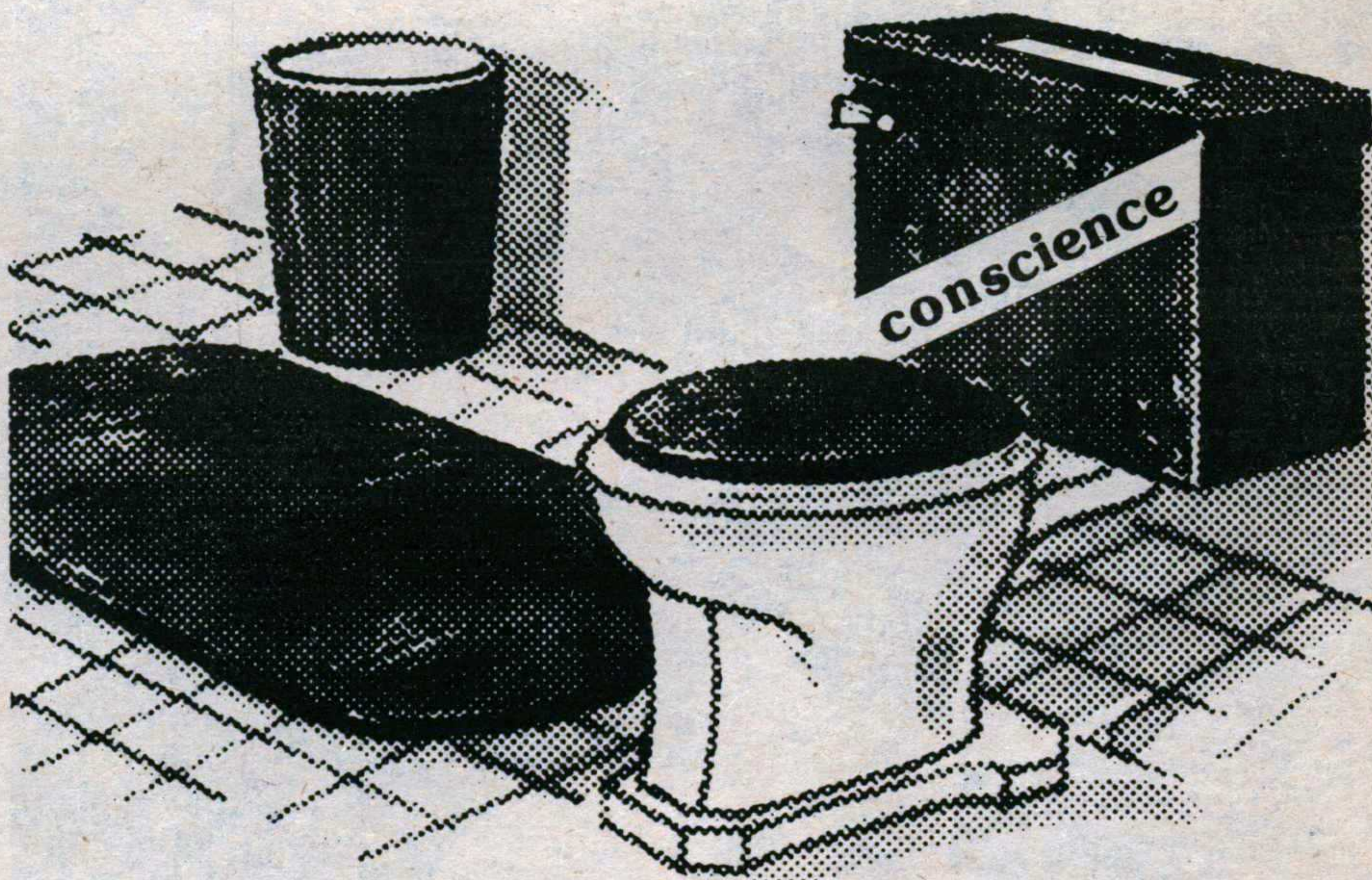
riddance, I fell asleep in his class more than Regan's.
