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## Entire Law School Faculty Named Dean

Recently, the entire Hofstra Law School faculty has been named Dean. This came as no surprise to most students. The administration has slowly and steadily been increasing the number of deanships at the school over the past few years. The latest appointments have been Deanna Hunter and Hugh Christenson as Vice Dean in charge of minority recruitment and student relations and Dean of placement and alumni relations, respectively. Now every faculty member boasts the title of "Dean." One student commented, "Well, when they made Hugh Christenson dean, I knew something big was going down."

In a rare appearance, Dean Schmertz held a press conference and gave a public statement. "I feel this move is a positive step toward increasing student communication with the administration. Now if students have a gripe, problem or question, they can

Eric Lane: "Don't look at me. I'm not here that much either."

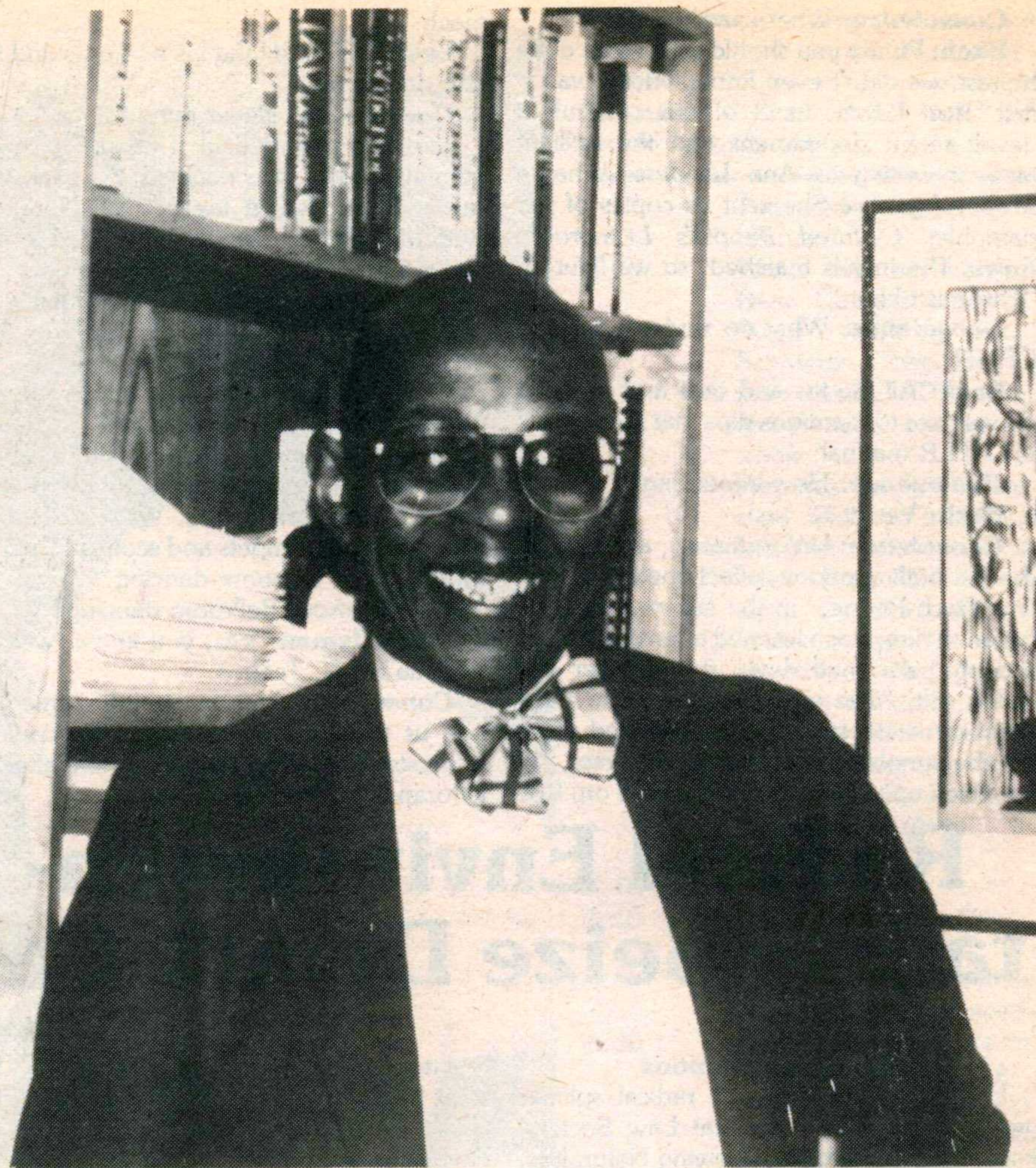
Larry Kessler: "A Law Dean should have two, if not more, black couches."

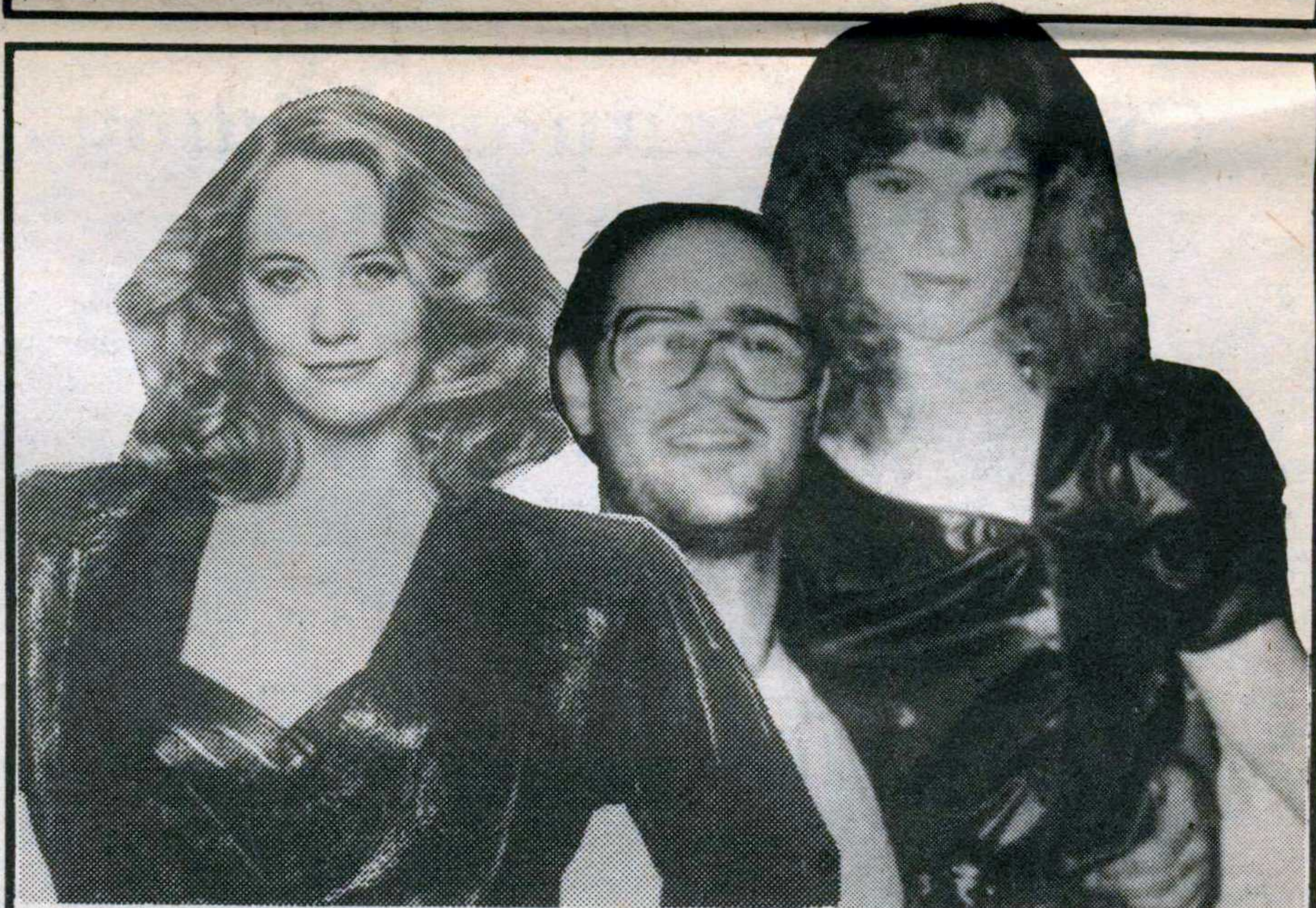

# Old Policy With New Name

It is common for the average Hofstra Law student to complain that the administration seems aloof and unconcerned with serious problems affecting the quality of our legal education. A memo from the Dean's office has finally confirmed what many of us have suspected for some time.

Until now, high level administrators have subtly and tacitly agreed to apply a policy which one dean, who asked to remain anonymous, dubbed "aggressive disinterest." This dean gave us the following disturbing statement: "Aggressive disinterest applies across the board. I can cite several examples. For instance, the NLO is understaffed, located above a smelly fish market and is roach infested. We tell them we're working on hiring and relocation. To be frank, it's not a priority. The Labor Law

Journal had to move on campus. As a result, several clubs lost a significant amount of office space. Do we care? ## Library Temperature Scam Uncovered

Next week we will be interviewing the student body of Hofstra Law School for more lifestyles of the boring and infamous.

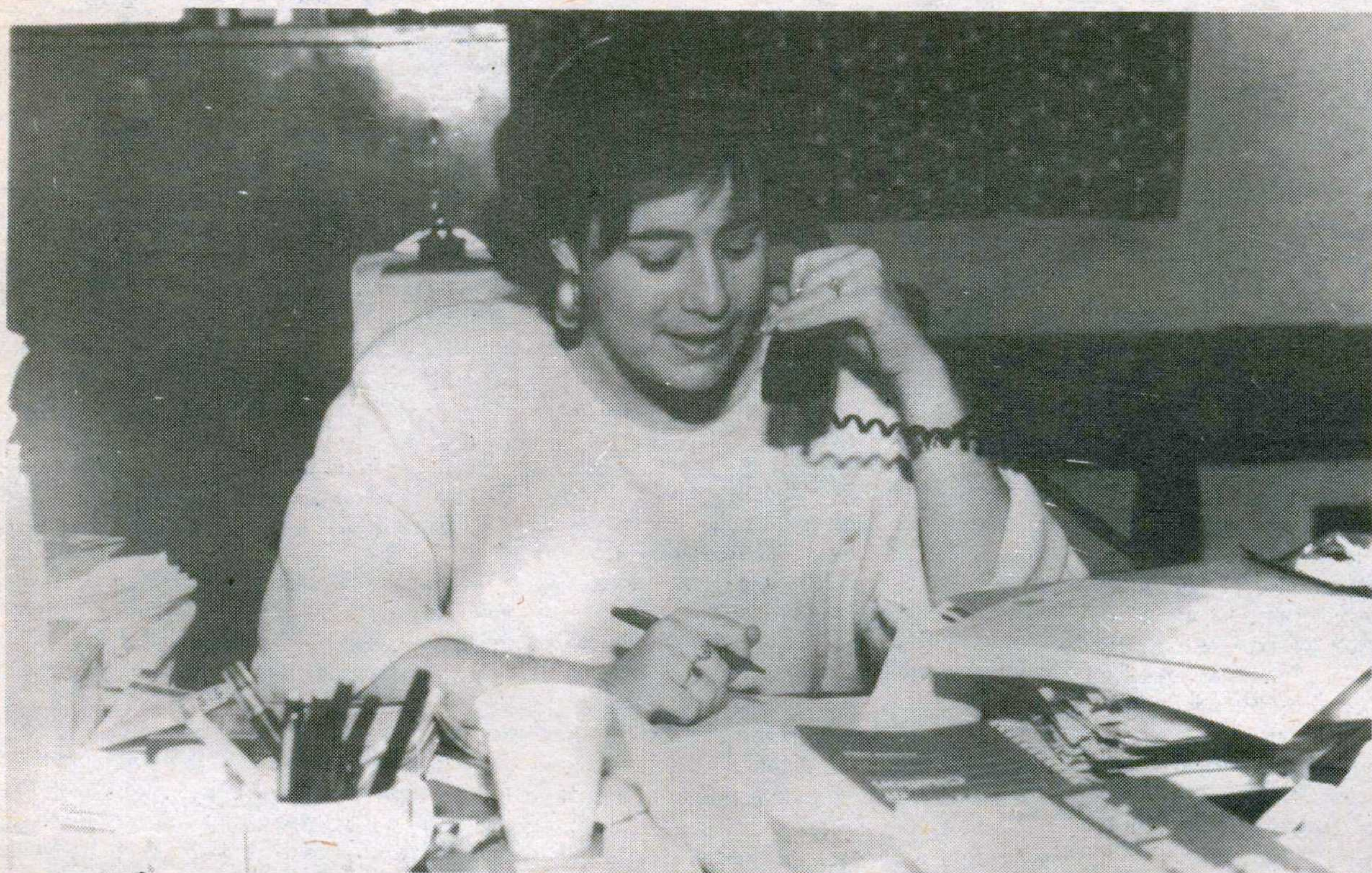
