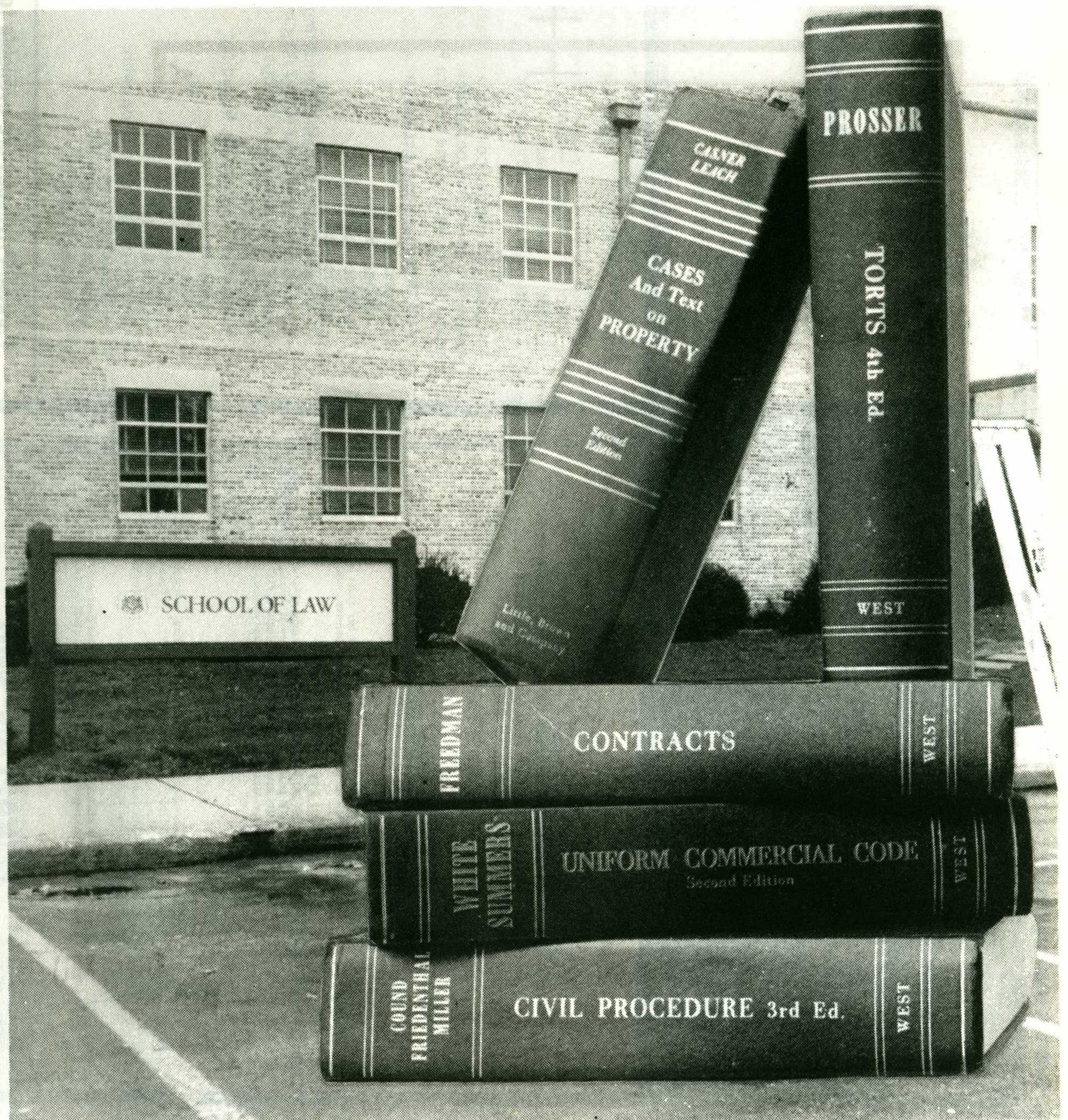

# DEAN'S CORNER:

Dean Eric J. Schmertz

I welcome you to the Hofstra Law School. You are beneficiaries of 17 years of effort and good work by present and former students, by the faculty, and by the School's various administrations. I know you will enhance that legacy.

Let me project you one year ahead -- one year from now. What will you have experienced here?

Of course, you will have completed the first year of Law School. To quote Professor Twerski some of you will say that you wouldn't do it again for \$1 million. There is no reason why each of you should not succeed. You number 278, and were selected from almost 3,000 applicants. You will have taken courses with a faculty that I consider to be outstanding -- indeed, in my view, second to none -- made up of several national authorities in their fields and all professionals and scholars of the highest calibre. Presently, eleven, and soon to be twelve, members of that faculty occupy endowed Distinguished Professorships.

You will have completed the first-year curriculum -- courses fundamental to the study, knowledge and practice of law. And perhaps more importantly courses that are the heart and soul of our society of law. You will conclude, I hope, that those who study and learn the law are the closest to and the architects of a society guided by and rooted in law -- a society that we think is the best that humans have yet devised. You will conclude, I hope, that there is not a glut of good lawyers; that litigation, with its contemporary companions of alternate dispute procedures, rather than to be scorned, is the most orderly, protective and fruitful way for disputes to be resolved. With vigilance and efforts toward a reduction in frivolous or non-meritorious cases, a "litigious society" is nothing to be ashamed of because it is a characteristic of a free society. You will have taken a giant step towards completion of one of the finest educational opportunities.

You will have used our Law Library of almost 260,000 volumes and have found it

comprehensive and complete. You will also have found it to be too small physically and overcrowded. We are working on doing something about that.

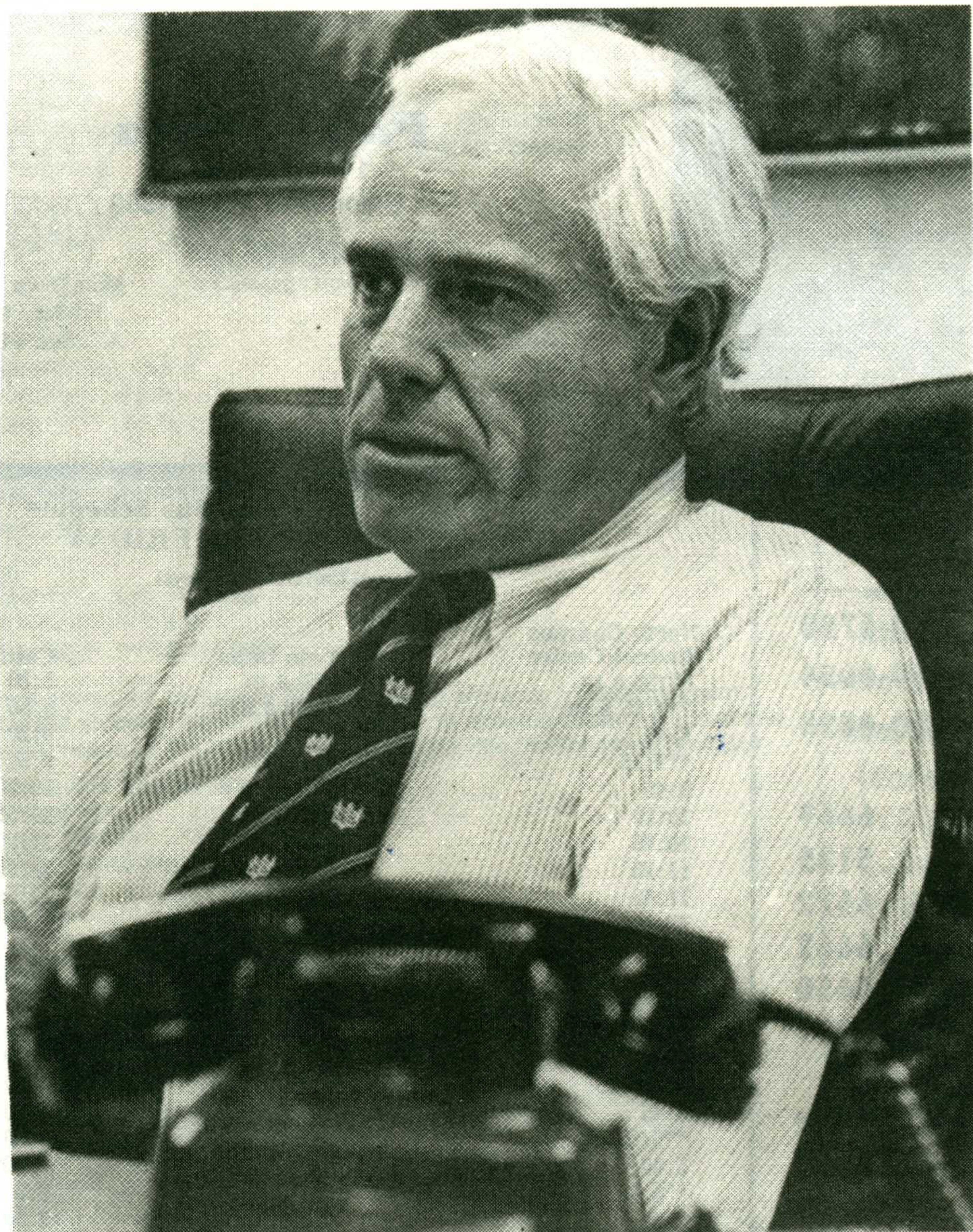
You will have learned of and some of you will become members of our three scholarly journals -- the Hofstra Law Review, ranked 7th in the country among all law reviews for the frequency it is quoted by other legal publications and important courts; the Labor Law Journal and the Hofstra Property Law Journal.

You will have had the chance to hear the annual Max Schmertz Lecture, the annual Howard Kaplan Lecture, the annual Benjamin Weintraub Lecture and a host of speakers invited by our student organizations.

You will have had the chance to attend a University-wide Conference on Group Defamation, directed by Professor Monroe Freedman of our faculty, a University-wide Presidential Conference -- this year on former President Richard M. Nixon -- directed by Professor Leon Friedman of our faculty; the annual Edward F. Carlough Labor Law Conference; the annual Hazardous Waste Conference and possibly conferences on health care law, communications and banking, all directed by our faculty. These upcoming activities build on the excellent conferences of past years on the Burger Court, the Bicentennial of the Constitution, and the Presidential Conferences on Franklin D. Roosevelt, Harry Truman, Dwight D. Eisenhower, John F. Kennedy and Lyndon Baines Johnson.

You will have completed initial training in moot court and advocacy, preparing you for upper-class moot court competition and for moot court competitions among the law schools in our region and nationally.

You will have learned of our Neighborhood Law Office and our clinical legal education courses which won a Presidential Award for public service and which are now being restaffed, updated and expanded to blend live-client clinics



with case simulation.

You will have begun contacts with our Placement Office which over the last few years reports 92% placement of our graduates each year within a few months of the bar examination, including our high rank among law schools in the northeast for the placement of graduates as clerks with prominent judges.

You will have joined a Law School whose bar passage rate is well above the State average.

You will have seen a collegial and professional relationship with the regional bar associations, for joint professional activities, externships, and ultimate employment.

Those of you with strong interests in trial advocacy will have seen that we host the annual sessions of the National Institute for Trial Advocacy and an annual program in Trial Techniques. In a later year you could be a participant in Trial Techniques.

And finally, you have experienced our philosophy -- to educate competent and ethical lawyers, mindful of due process, fair play and the public interest, for all legitimate sectors of American society. And you will have made new, life-long friends and colleagues among those sitting with you today.

Thanks for joining us. I wish you every success.

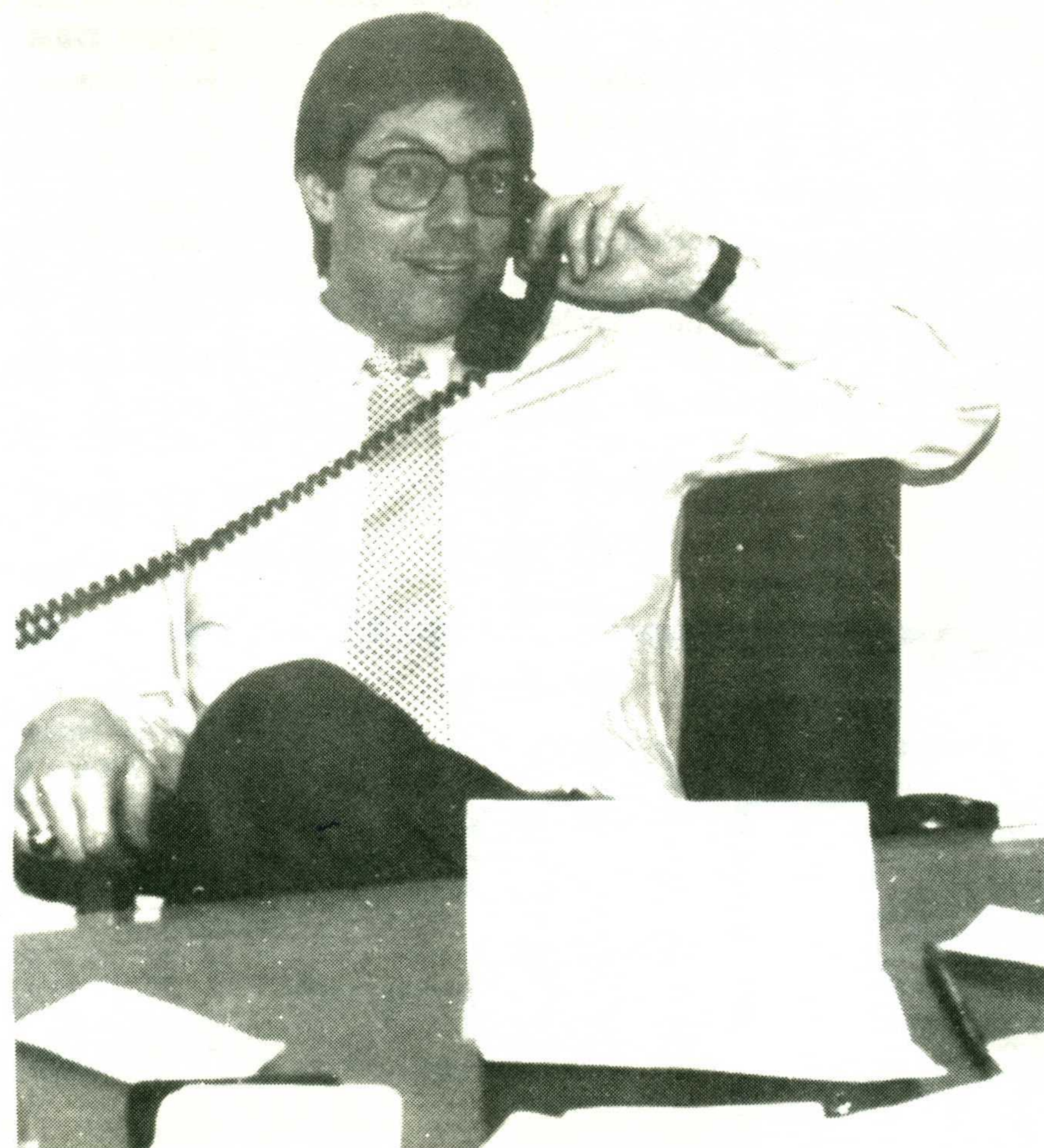

We wish you well as you begin your legal education. I look forward to meet you in the coming weeks and months.

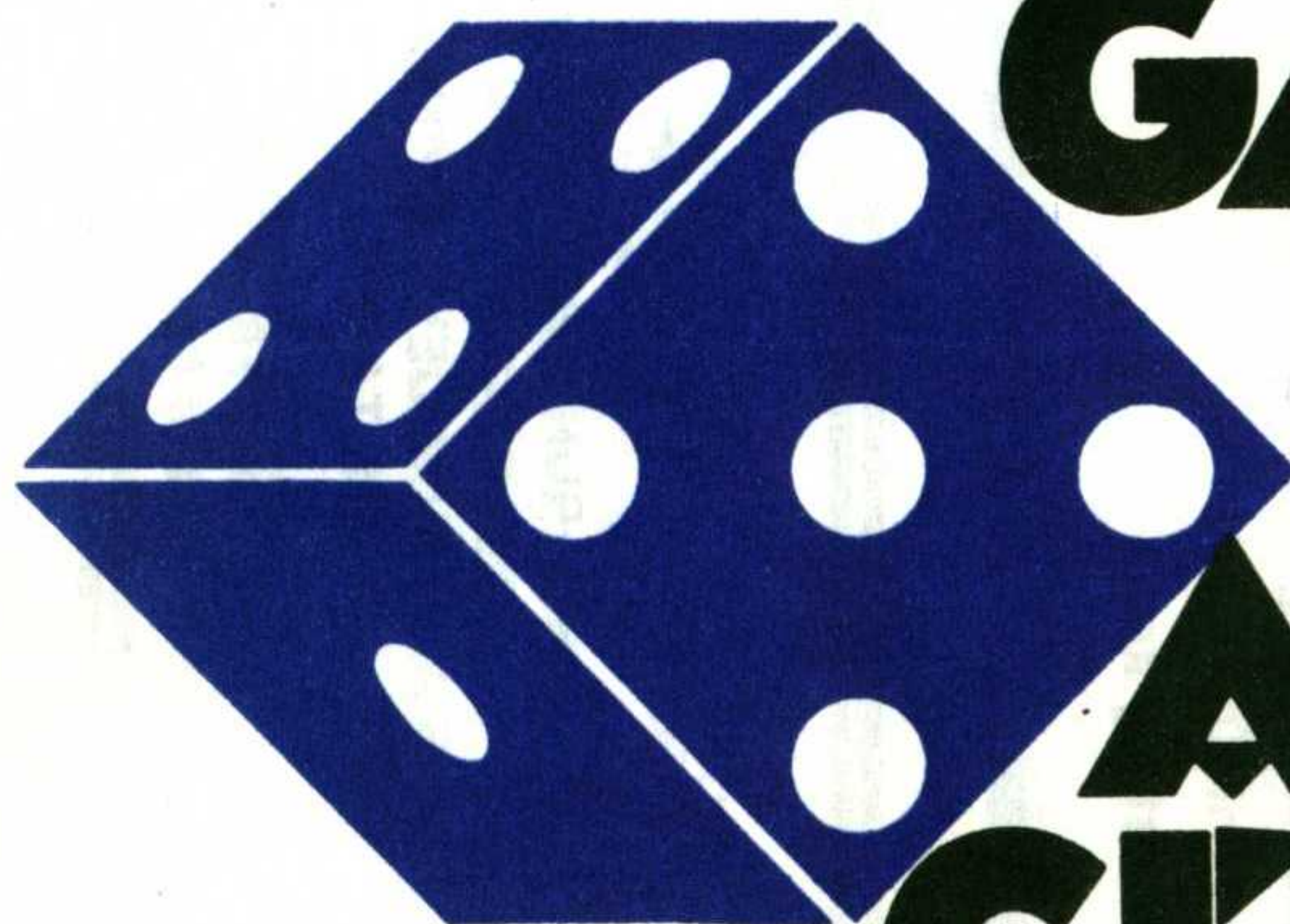
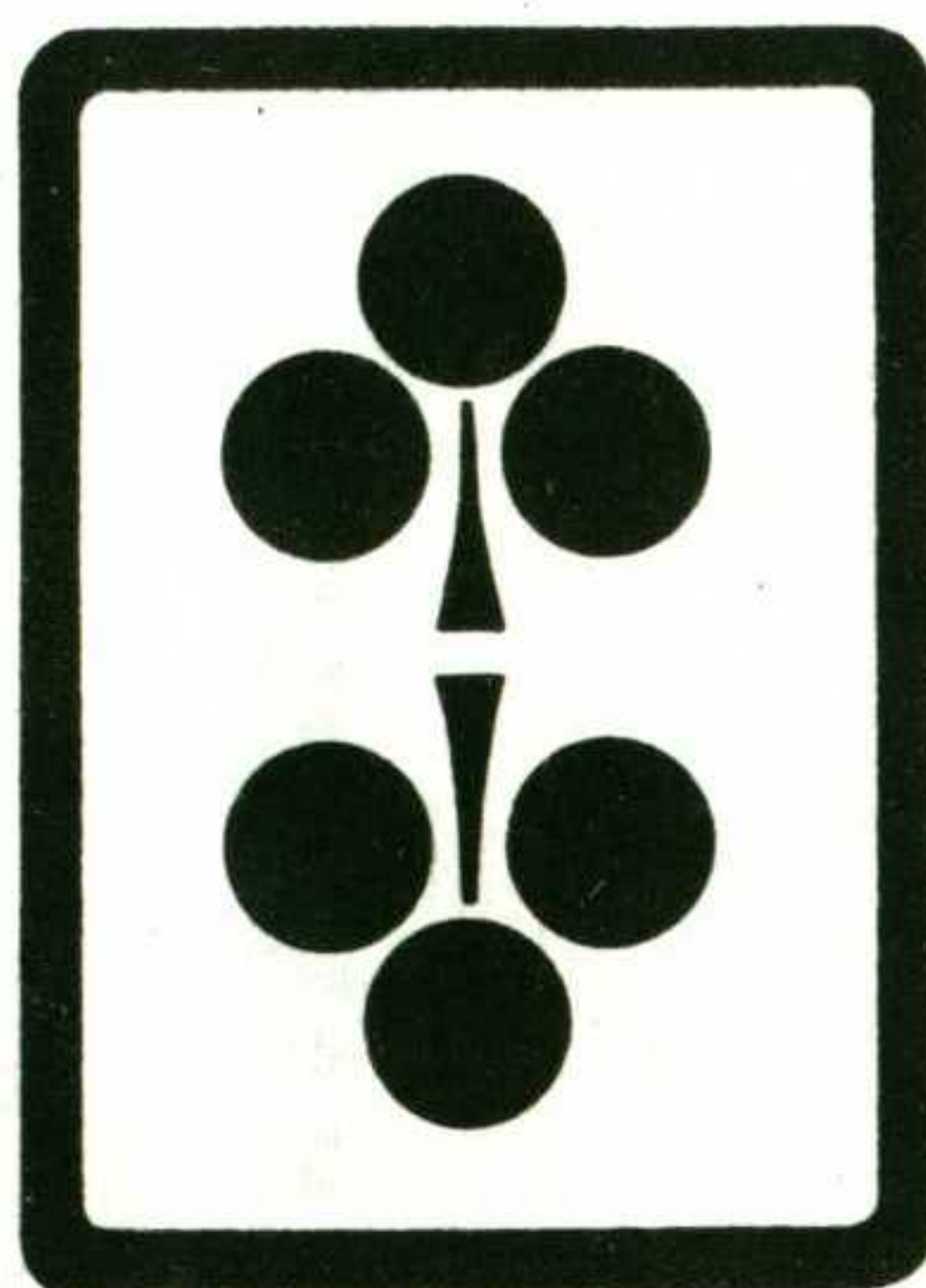
